#### **Admissions Information**

Thank you for your interest in the Generic (Basic) Nursing program at California State University, Los Angeles (CSULA). This is a wonderful time to be entering nursing. The need for professionally prepared nurses is great, and there are increasing opportunities for practice in many areas.

The CSULA School of Nursing (SON) has ONLY ONE applicant pool annually. From this one applicant pool, we will accept one class for the 2011-2012 academic year (beginning Fall 2011).

Our basic nursing program is a traditional full-time over an eleven-quarter sequence. The program includes general education combined with theoretical and clinical nursing courses. Upon completion of the program you will be awarded a bachelor degree and will become eligible for licensure as a register nurse. Students who enter in Fall 2011 can expect to graduate in December 2014. Courses are offered at variable days and times and involve travel to clinical sites in many areas of Los Angeles County. It is a demanding, full-time program; and it is not compatible with a heavy outside workload.

Please read these instructions carefully and submit your completed forms by the printed deadlines. Please adhere to the following application instructions.

\*Note: The School of Nursing will not process incomplete and/or illegible application forms.

It is the applicant's responsibility to provide complete and accurate materials by the appropriate deadlines. Applications that are incomplete will not be considered for review.

If you change your address, name, and/or phone number during the application period you must notify the Nursing Advisement Office in writing as soon as possible. If we do not receive your information change you may lose priority for space.

## DEADLINES FOR APPLICANTS SCHOOL OF NURSING FALL 2011 APPLICANT POOLS

## 1. <u>September 1 - December 1, 2010</u>

Applications are accepted from September 1 through December 1 for 2011-2012 admission pool. Applications will not be accepted if postmarked before September 1 or after December 1, 2010.

- Faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted.
- •Applications must be submitted by hand or mailed.

Unless you are currently enrolled at CSULA, you must **APPLY for ADMISSIONS online** at <u>www.csumentor.edu</u>. **Note:** You must adhere to the POSTED DEADLINES FOR APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY.

## 2. <u>December 1, 2010</u>

<u>Submission of Supplementary Application</u> This is a statement of your intent to apply to the School of Nursing (SON) for the 2011 and 2012 applicant pools. Applications received after December 1, 2010 will not be considered. Your completed application packet must be mailed or delivered to the CSULA School of Nursing Advisement Office (Simpson Tower 415). In order to confirm your application has been received it must be sent by certified mail with return receipt requested.

- Your Application Packet must include the following to be considered complete:
  - 1) Applicant checklist
  - 2) Application for the Basic BSN Program Fall 2011 applicant pool.
  - 3) Official transcripts of all college work including course work in progress. These transcripts are <u>in</u> <u>addition</u> to the official transcripts that are required by the University Admissions Office. NOTE: University Admissions does not share transcripts with the School of Nursing; and the School of Nursing does not share transcripts with Admissions.

If you have attended a California community college, please request that your community college send official <u>CSU GE Certified transcripts</u> when you request your transcripts for the SON *and* University Admissions. If you must have transcripts sent directly from your school to the SON, please note on your SON application which transcripts you have requested and the date they were requested.

#### Also include:

- A copy of your current California Driver License.
- <u>Documentation</u> of Health-Care-Related work experience, previous baccalaureate or higher degrees, and/or documentation of health-care-related-volunteer hours.
- If you have a <u>license or certificate</u> in the health care field, please include a copy with a photo ID.
- If you have completed <u>volunteer work</u> in a health-care-related field, the volunteer coordinator for that organization must provide an official statement (on company letterhead) indicating your total volunteer hours completed. Please include the coordinator's business card. If your <u>volunteer hours are still in progress</u>, submit verification of the hours you have completed to date.
- Include three business-size, self-addressed-stamped envelopes size 4 1/8"x 91/2".

Please do not call the SON for application status when the screening process is complete, you will be notified by mail.

## 3. November 1, 2010

Deadline to register for the ATI (Test of Essential Academic Skills)

## 4. November 12-November 13, 2010

The ATI will be administered at CSULA on the above dates.

This is a <u>mandatory requirement</u> for all applicants to the basic nursing program. <u>Failure to take this test will automatically disqualify you</u> from the applicant pool.

You may repeat the ATI <u>once only</u> per application cycle. Arrangements to repeat the test are the responsibility of the applicant's ATI test results must be in the CSULA SON by **December 31, 2010.** 

Applicants whose ATI scores are below the minimum acceptable 40<sup>th</sup> percentile for the "Individual Percentile Rank National Score in any area will be sent letters denying admission to the nursing program. Note: This nursing admission process is separate from the University admission. You may receive a letter of admission from the University while your application to Nursing is still pending or after you have been denied admission to Nursing.

## ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE COMMENCES FINAL RANKING PROCESS.

• <u>Deadline for completion of SIX prerequisite courses:</u> Chemistry 151, Biology 200A & 200B; English 101, Psychology 150, and a General Education Critical Thinking Course, or the equivalent courses taken elsewhere. To check the transferability of your courses please go to <a href="www.assist.org">www.assist.org</a>. Applications will be rejected if official transcripts showing your work in progress are not received in the SON Advisement office by specified deadline.

#### It is not the responsibility of the SON to notify students of missing documentation.

## 6. May 15, 2011

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION COMMITTEE ACTION. Admission committee's notification will be made upon completion of the applicant ranking process. Acceptance letters will be mailed by May 15, 2011. Waiting list and rejection letters may be sent later as not all students accepted may choose to attend. PLEASE DO NOT CALL the office for information about your application. We cannot release information via telephone.

## 7. June 22, 2011

Public speaking and microbiology grades are due on this date.

#### **Additional Information**

Increasingly, clinical agencies are requiring that students (and faculty) be drug-free and may be subject to random drug testing. <u>Criminal background checks</u> are required by the California Board of Registered Nursing prior to initial licensure. This same procedure is also required by some of our clinical agencies prior to student rotations.

If you were **previously enrolled in a nursing program,** please attach a letter including the type of program, name of the school, school address, dates enrolled, and reason for leaving. Students who have not been successful in other programs are usually not accepted for admission to the CSULA basic program.

Disclosure of one's Social Security number is mandatory for licensure by the BRN in accordance with Section 30 of the Business and Professions Code and Public Law 94-455 (42 USCA 405 (c) (2) (C).

Because of the number of applicants for the program, completion of all entrance requirements does not ensure selection for the basic nursing program.

It is the responsibility of all applicants to check with the Financial Aid Office regarding loans, scholarships, state and federal grants. If you have not already applied, do so as soon as possible.

# APPROVED SUPPLEMENTAL CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION THE BASIC NURSING PROGRAM (NON-RNS)

Supplementary applications will be available September 1 - December 1, 2010

Students <u>must complete the minimum prerequisite courses</u>, <u>ATI test</u>, and <u>GPA requirements to be eligible for admission into the Basic program</u>. There are a maximum of 31 possible *supplemental criteria for admission* points which can be earned.

Applicants are ranked based on their points earned according to the supplementary criteria. The top-ranked students will be sent letters of acceptance.

Students will be ranked in order for admission according to the following point structure:

## **Supplemental Criteria Points**

#### Grade point average (GPA) in prerequisite courses

10 points max

**The prerequisite GPA** is computed using the following **six prerequisite courses**: Chemistry 151\*, Biology 200A & 200B\*; English 101\*, Psychology 150\*, and a \*General Education Critical Thinking Course, or the equivalent courses taken elsewhere.

A C-minus (C-) grade in these courses is not acceptable. The School Of Nursing <u>will not recognize</u> repetition of a course when the original grade was a C or better.

Any grade of less than a "C" on a class required for nursing hurts your chance of admission, even if you have successfully repeated that class.

## \* The above six prerequisite classes must be completed by March 23, 2011

The prerequisite GPA is computed by averaging the grades earned in the courses, with each course equally weighted. If a course is repeated because of an <u>unsuccessful first attempt</u>, the grades are averaged in computing the GPA. <u>No more than 1 repetition of any course is allowed</u>. The minimum acceptable GPA for the prerequisite courses is 2.75.



## ATI/TEAS (TEST OF ESSENTIAL ACADEMIC SKILLS)

This test is a mandatory requirement for all applicants.

*Note:* You must **first** submit your application to the CSULA School of Nursing for the Basic program **then** schedule your ATI/TEAS exam. All testers must create an ATI account prior to taking a paper/pencil test. They can create an account at <a href="www.atitesting.com">www.atitesting.com</a> by clicking on Create New Account and following the screen prompts. After a tester has registered on the site, the tester's personal paper/paper ID will displayed under Account Information. At this screen, the user will have an opportunity to print the paper/pencil ID. Each user should print and retain this and use it for identification on every paper/pencil test. This ID number will not change, the tester only needs to register once.

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is a scholastic aptitude test that is used as one component of the selection process for the admission of students into the basic nursing program. The TEAS consists of four content areas: Math, Reading, English, and Science. Applicants to the CSULA Basic Program must complete the examination with a <u>minimum passing National Percentile Rank</u> in each of the four subtest areas (currently the minimum score is the 40th percentile).

**All subtests contain** multiple-choice items with one correct answer. The applicant is directed to answer each item as accurately as possible within the allotted time. The reporting system for the TEAS includes a **composite score** for each of the four general areas. Sixteen sub-scores are generated within these categories to assess specific content mastery. Identifying areas of relative strength and weakness can help the student in preparing for nursing.

The **Math** subtest covers whole numbers, metric conversion, fractions and decimals, algebraic equations, percentages and ratio/proportion.

**Reading** covers paragraph comprehension, passage comprehension and inferences/conclusions.

The **English** subtest measures knowledge of punctuation, grammar, sentence structure, contextual words and spelling.

The **Science** portion of the exam covers science reasoning, science knowledge, biology, chemistry, anatomy and physiology, basic physical principles and general science.

<u>Use of an ATI/TEAS study guide</u> is <u>HIGHLY</u> recommended and can be purchased from ATI at <u>www.atitesting.com</u>.

**Note:** Examination fees are non-refundable and are good for this application period only.

This notice is written to inform you of the steps necessary to register for the November 2010 TEAS exams. The TEAS exam will <u>not</u> be administered by the CSULA School of Nursing.
